As always, the conference provides an interactive forum for the exchange of ideas, and an excellent opportunity to renew acquaintances, network and make new friends. The social programme will feature some of Melbourne's iconic venues.

Our welcome reception will take place at Melbourne's hottest roof top bar, The Duke of Wellington. The gala dinner is always one of the highlights on the social programme and this year is no exception, with this year's dinner being held at Melbourne's iconic Plaza Ballroom — one of Melbourne's most historic and beautiful venues. Titus O'Reily will provide his comedic thoughts on the sporting legal profession at the dinner which shapes as a highlight of the evening. At its annual conference each year, ANZSLA presents this award to a person who has never presented at an ANZSLA event or been previously published in the ANZSLA Journal, and who, in the judges' opinion, submits the best paper in accordance with the award guidelines. The judging takes into account the paper's accuracy, originality, practical value to sports administrators and lawyers, and its academic quality.

## GETTING TO THE GLASSHOUSE

The Glasshouse is on the 70 tram route. Get off at stop 7D (Olympic Boulevard) and walk across the road and you are at the Glasshouse. The tram goes along Flinders street so any stop along there will be fine. It will take 5-10 minutes to go from the Melbourne CBD to the Glasshouse by tram.

You can also walk to the Glasshouse along the Yarra but this will take 20 minutes or so, depending on which hotel you are staying at.

Those staying closer to the Docklands can go to stop D10 situated on Docklands Drive (right near the hotels) (tram #70) which will take them to stop 7D (Olympic Boulevard).

Then walk for a couple of minutes to the Glasshouse which is across the road from stop 7D. It is 16 tram stops in all.


